### **SBAC Testing at T.I.S.**

#### **The SBAC at Tolland Intermediate School**

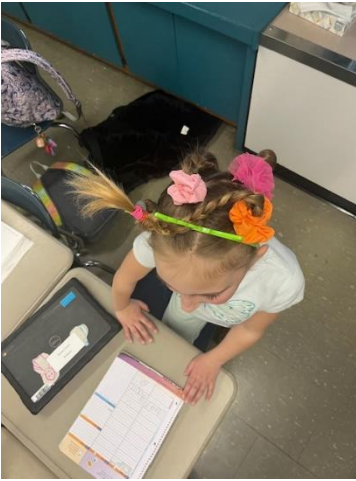
This year students across the nation will again participate in new versions of state mandated standardized assessments. Connecticut's computerized test, developed by the Smarter Balance Assessment Consortium, is aligned to the Common Core State Standards in English language arts/literacy and mathematics.

The SBAC requires students to take a total of three tests, two in English language arts and two in mathematics. In order to test all students, we have developed a schedule that will test one grade-level at a time, during our testing window, which begins on May 6 and ends on May 10. Our schedule provides two-hour testing blocks for each grade-level. While individual subtests are not expected to take two hours, we have included extra time to account for test set-up. In addition, students will be permitted to test longer than the allotted time if needed. Each grade level will be tested during our designated two-hour block each morning.

Our goal in developing an SBAC testing schedule has been to minimize disruption to our typical school day. Minimizing disruption will entail students attending specials, inclusive of technology integration, keyboarding and multi-media research within the library time block.

## NEW ITEMS THIS WEEK:

### *Unified Arts Update for March 2024*



**Art ~ Library ~ Music ~ Physical Education**

#### **Ms. Ballard - Art**

**Grade 3:** Our third graders will be working on the Element of Art called **Space this month**. The students will be creating a drawing with a **foreground, middle ground, and a background** in their artwork. The picture will look **3D** by using a new art medium called **3D'Os**. This project will take us the whole month to construct so be on the look for them come April.

**Grade 4:** **The fourth graders are starting a new project** dealing with all of the **Elements of Art**. This project will last a few weeks as we learn more about all of the Elements of Art, which are line, color, texture, shape, value, shape and space. Students will be working on 9" x 12" white paper to create a powerful design illustrating all 7 of the **Elements of Art**.

**Grade 5:** Our fifth graders will be working on a new project as well learning about **Tessellations**. A **Tessellation** is a design with no gaps or overlapping images. The artist we will be inspired by is **M.C.Escher**. This project will take us the whole month of March and part of April. Students will select an animal pattern to use in their tessellation. Once the animal tessellation is drawn the student will then color them using colored pencils. All student's marionettes have been graded and should be going home this week.

#### **Mrs. Hill - Library Media**

**Grade 3:** From mid-February to the end of March, third graders will be exploring **Folk and Fairy Tales!** They will listen/watch a tale, write notes about important characteristics like characters, setting, and magical elements, then draw a picture on the back of their favorite, or an important, part of the story. Their pages will be collected and eventually collated into individual "books" the students can take home. They will write about one tale each week and watch a second tale that will just be discussed. The students are very excited to talk about their opinions of the characters and their actions in these traditional folk and fairy tales! **The Folk and Fairy Tale unit will end with a STEM challenge to see who can create the tallest beanstalk** without tipping over the giant, the golden goose and his harp!



**Grade 4** In March, fourth grade students are all about research! They will use books, encyclopedias, dictionaries, magazines, and websites to research wild animals.

**Grade 5** During the month of March, fifth grade students are working on fiction and nonfiction writing. Students chose a topic to do some research about and then they had to write a creative, short fiction story on that topic. The students did this work in Google Slides and when writing was complete, they were encouraged to add pictures, fonts, color, design, transitions and animation to their slideshows. The stories were amazing!

**\*\*THE LIBRARY IS ALWAYS “OPEN”! Your student is encouraged to put books on hold at school or at home and the library staff will deliver the books to their classroom! So easy!**



## Ms. Baker - General Music

**Grade 3 general music:** The third graders are currently Learning to read music by learning the soprano recorders. The recorder is a woodwind instrument used to introduce band skills and techniques in the third grade curriculum. During March and April, the third graders will also be learning about the instruments of the band and orchestra in preparation for choosing a musical instrument for the fourth grade band in September. Students are encouraged to participate in both chorus and band in fourth

grade.



**Grade 4 general music:** In the fourth grade general music classes the students are completing their unit on African music by learning and practicing their hand drumming skills. They will be reviewing the skills and knowledge they learned during the African unit through cooperative stations. In April, they will be learning about the music of Asia and Chinese music notation. We will also be discussing opportunities for next year in grade 5 band and chorus. Students will be encouraged to participate in both grade 5 band

and chorus next. Both groups are a great opportunity to expand their musical abilities and have fun!



**Grade 5 general music:** The fifth graders are completing their unit on Hawaiian music with a cooperative composing and performing project. During the month of April, they will be practicing their ukulele chord progressions and songs to record for a digital composing project. The ukulele is a great instrument for students to learn to play. I am excited that so many students have taken the initiative to purchase their own ukuleles and continue using what they have learned at home.

**Grade 4 and 5 Chorus:** Chorus members are refining their performance skills and preparing for their **concert** on ***Thursday, April 25th to be held at TIS in the cafeteria.*** ***The grade 4 chorus concert will be at 6:15 p.m. Students are to arrive by 6:00.*** ***The grade 5 chorus concert will be at 7:30. Students are to arrive at 7:15.*** Both choruses will continue to meet weekly after the Concert through June.

### **4th & 5th Grade Band and 3rd Grade Mx3 Chorus**

**Grade 4 Band:** Band members are working towards mastery of performance skills needed for their first Band Concert! Rest position, playing position, solo/tutti and playing in rounds are some of the skills we are refining. Our first band arrangement piece titled “Attack of the Slide Trombones” features our trombone section having fun with glissandos and the entire band focusing on dynamic changes in the piece.

Small group instructional Band classes and WIN Full Band continue through the beginning of June.

**Grade 5 Band:** In 5th grade Band classes, students are using self-reflection and peer feedback to refine individual and ensemble performances of a variety of music selections planned for their TMS Step Up Concert on March 18th and a Spring Concert. A 5th grade Band favorite is “This Old Dude” which contains variations on the traditional tune “This Old Man”. Students have tackled learning

the Concert Eb “Scale Preps for Beginning Band” by Mike Hannickel and other pieces written in Concert Eb.

Small group instructional Band classes and WIN Full Band continue through the beginning of June.

**Music Times Three (Mx3) - 3rd grade Chorus:** This 81-member Chorus has mastered singing in rounds! “A Ram Sam Sam” will be performed at our upcoming evening Concert on March 21st at 6:30 p.m. in the TIS “Cafetorium”. Other concepts we’ve been refining include expressive singing (varying soft, medium loud or loud within the same piece) and using call and response style.

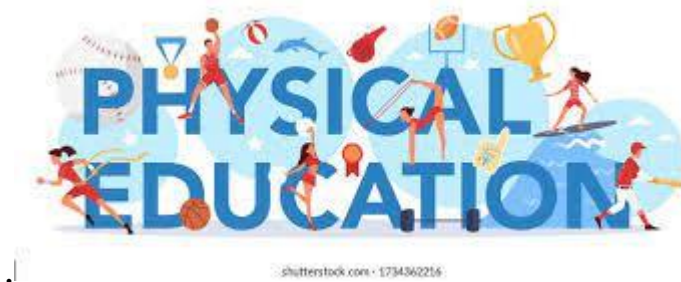

## WHAT'S HAPPENING IN OUR CLASSROOMS:

### GRADE 3

Mrs. Babiec's class recently visited the Wadsworth Museum



Third graders have been working hard since we returned from our Winter break. We have also had a lot of fun watching them play in our quickly melting snow. Let's hope for a little more before the winter is over. Please send your child to school with a winter jacket, snow pants, gloves, a hat and boots to play in the snow. Boots are good even when there isn't snow, so they can play on the field even when it is a bit muddy.

In Bridges Math we are finishing up Unit 4, which focused on telling time and measurement. We used clocks to tell time to the nearest minute. Your child will use a number line to answer questions about elapsed time. You can help at home by encouraging them to read clocks and figuring out how long different activities take to complete. We will be moving on to Unit 5 in the next week or so. Unit 5 focuses more on multiplication, division and area. We'll review fact families, connect multiplication and division with workplaces and word problems. As always, you can help at home by practicing math facts with your child.

In Language Arts we are in Unit 3 and moving on to Unit 4 of the Journeys program. We have read texts about how technology has helped to advance the sports that we do. This week we read a trickster tale called Tops and Bottoms. Third graders focused on sequence of events, text and graphic features and plural nouns. In the upcoming weeks we'll read a Cherokee Legend, and focus on comparing and contrasting, as well as story messages. Aero and Officer Mike was an informational text about a police dog and his partner. Students learned about text features and how service animals help in the community. We'll be moving on to Units 7 and 8 in Foundations where we learn about changing y to i in open syllables and pluralizing words.

We have begun the Science unit the Case of the Odd Motions. Your child will be learning about forces and motion. We have fun experiments for pushes and pulls, gravity, static electricity, and magnetism.

Our classes have been going to the Wadsworth Atheneum over the last couple of weeks. The students, teachers and parents really enjoyed this trip. Students were taken on a tour by a docent to see artwork that focused on the People and Places in CT. They saw a picture frame, baby cradle, and chair made from the wood of the famous Charter Oak tree. The Wadsworth Atheneum is a beautiful museum, and we told the students to ask you to go back so they could explore more. I encourage you to check out their website for kid friendly activities on the weekend.

## GRADE 4

The month of February flew by-even with the extra day!

We have concluded February's Number Corner which focused largely on geometry, measurement, and fractions. Students learned to use a protractor to measure and draw angles. Throughout the month, students identified, compared, and classified lines, angles, and polygons. As we move into March, Number Corner activities will extend our learning of fractions and decimals. A focus will also be on patterns and functions. Fourth grade students continue to work with standard and metric units of measurement for time, length, weight, and volume.

In Language Arts, we started Unit 3, “Inside Nature.” This unit focuses on non-fiction selections about understanding what’s happening in the natural world around us. This unit aligns nicely with the next social studies unit. Students have been engaged in non-fiction writing skills, such as research, planning, and drafting an informational piece of writing.

As students wrap up their erosion performance task, we will move to our next unit in Social Studies which focuses on the Northeast Region.

We continue to encourage students to read and practice their math skills at home. Remember that Reflex Math, Frax, and IXL can be accessed at home and provide students with excellent opportunities to improve their skills.

Our upcoming selections in Journeys focus on story structure, fact and opinion, understanding characters, conclusions and generalizations, and author’s purpose. The students will be working on informational writing.

Fourth grade students are working diligently to master fractions and decimals, using various strategies and manipulatives. We continue to use IXL and Reflex Math to strengthen our skills, as well as FRAX to complete missions involving fractions.

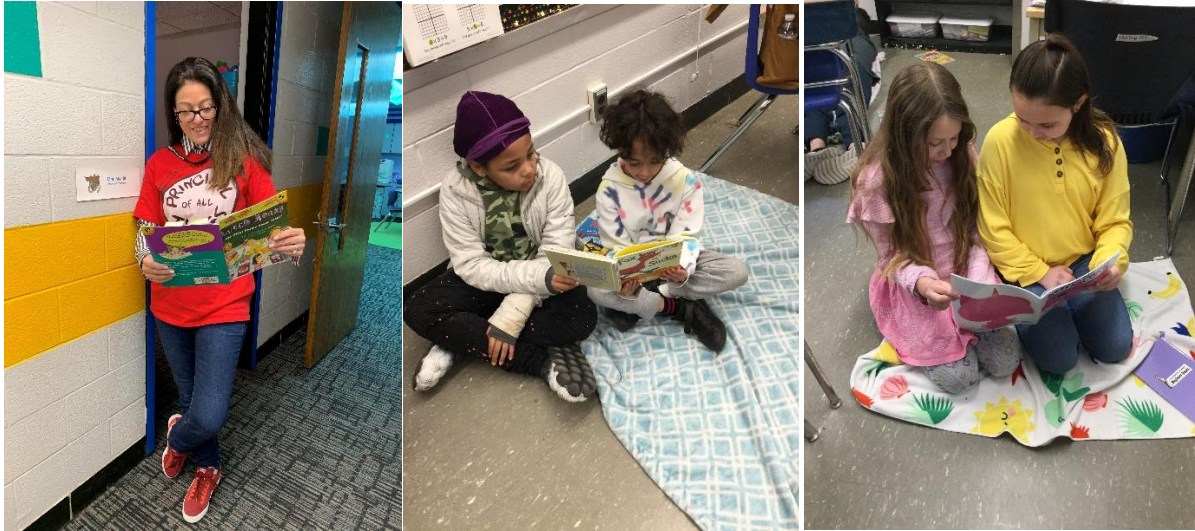
In science, we are well into our second unit, which focuses on landforms and features around the world, wave patterns, and how our environment is constantly changing. The driving essential questions of this unit include:

- Why do waves affect the erosion of earth features?
- How do earth processes affect humans, and how do humans affect earth processes?

Students are using background knowledge from our first unit to make connections, and they will showcase what they've learned through a performance task assessment beginning in February. Students will be developing a plan (and potentially building a small model) to help control coastline erosion. We're excited to see what they come up with!

Students have been learning about world geography and map reading skills in social studies. Recently, students have begun creating their own fun-themed continents to showcase what they've learned about the features of maps. We've got some great maps in the works so far including Ice Cream Island, Mario World, Soccerland, and so much more. Ask your 4th grader all about it! Our next unit will include studies about the Northeast region.

## GRADE 5

It has been an exciting winter in 5th grade! Fifth Graders have been working hard on their monthly genre book reports. So far, we have covered realistic fiction, mystery, historical fiction, fantasy, Nutmeg Award, biography and we are completing a science fiction text for the month of March. What has been your child's favorite so far? We love seeing all of the amazing texts students are choosing each month! For the month of April, we will be reading poetry!

In ELA, students are well into reading our second novel "The Phantom Tollbooth," by Norton Juster. This entertaining book used literal and figurative language for a play on words. Students will soon begin our last module for fifth grade, "Breaking Barriers." In this module students will read the text, "We Are the Ship," by Kadir Nelson. Students will learn how sports affect how people view each other, to create opportunities for people, and to help people overcome and challenge barriers. Students will read and

research a variety of informational texts about individual athletes, coaches, teams, and organizations to answer the question: How can sports influence individuals and societies?

In Social Studies, students continue to learn about Early Settlements and Colonization. They are investigating the essential question, “How did colonization affect and change the freedom of various groups?” They are also investigating what life was like for various groups of people after colonization. Students will compare and contrast the three regions of the English colonies (New England, Middle, Southern) during the 1600s. Students have also been practicing their skills using IXL.

In Math, students are wrapping up their learning on multiplying and dividing whole numbers and decimals. Students learned ratio tables, partial product, area model, standard algorithm and many other strategies! They learned new workplace games such as beat the calculator, estimate and check, lowest remainder wins, and multiplication battle. Our next unit will be on multiplying and dividing fractions.

In Science, we are wrapping up our ecosystems unit by learning about the human impact we have on various ecosystems. Students' final assessment will be to make a new home for the Golden Jellyfish and explain all the needs for the ecosystem to survive and thrive. In Trimester 3, we will move into our next unit on water phenomena.

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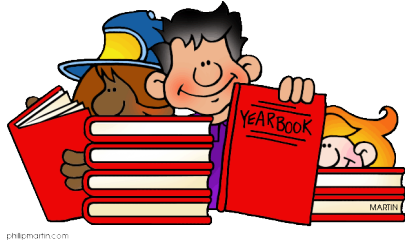

## School Meals 2023-2024:

All students are eligible for a free breakfast each day. Students who qualify for free or **reduced-price meals** will also be eligible to receive one free lunch daily. **ALL OTHER LUNCHES WILL BE CHARGED AT THE CURRENT LUNCH PRICE PER SCHOOL.**

Payment for these lunches is the responsibility of the parent or guardian. The district participates in the National School Lunch Program and Breakfast Program which offers students nutritionally balanced meals daily. The lunch period is 30 minutes. Proper manners are always expected in the cafeteria. Free and reduced price meals are available based on financial need. Information on this program may be obtained from the main office or Abby Kassman-Harned, the Food Service Director, at [aharned@tolland.k12.ct.us](mailto:aharned@tolland.k12.ct.us) or 870-6854.

We use a Point-of-Sale System that allows you to put money into an account for your child to purchase meals.

Scanning – All students will be scanned unless the parent or guardian opts out of this biometric identification procedure. When your child comes through the service line, he/she will scan his/her finger as a means of identification.

Payments – The cost of lunch at Birch Grove and Tolland Intermediate school is \$3.15. One school breakfast is free for all students. One milk is provided for each lunch and breakfast. Ala carte milk is \$0.75. You may sign up for [“My School Account”](#) and make your payments online. Your child may give payment along with a form to his/her classroom teacher to send to the office, or he/she may bring payment directly to the cashier in the cafeteria at mealtime. Your payment may take us a few days to process. It is important to keep a positive balance in your students’ accounts.
