Unified Arts Update for September & October







Ms. Ballard - ART Welcome back! It's great to see all your happy faces!

Grade 3- This year our third graders will be focusing on learning the Elements of Art.

Each project that we do will focus on one or more of the **Elements of Art.** We will be starting off with the first project called **Arts to Remember.** This project will focus on the **Elements of Art** called **Color.** For this first assignment each student was asked to draw a picture using **nine** different colors.



Grade 4 - Grade four artists will start the year by working with the Elements of Art, called Line and Color. They will be working on their Arts to Remember project as well as the 3rd graders. Their assignment is to make a **design** using their name, their current age, and 6 drawings about things they currently like. After the Arts to Remember project the 4th graders will move onto Paper Mosaics.

Grade 5 - Grade five students will be starting off the year with two projects: one 2D and the other is 3D. The first project is their **Art to** Remember, a 2D project. They will also do a design with their names, age and 8 items they want you to know about them. The second project is a 3D Puppet called a Marionette.. The student will need to bring in paper towel rolls and toilet paper rolls for this project. All 5th graders will need a shoebox to hold art materials for this project and future art project. Shoe boxes will be stored in their art lockers.

- All students should bring in a smock to wear during art to protect their clothes. The smock can be placed in the Ziplock baggie until needed.
- All T. I. S. students have been asked to join Ms. Ballard's Google Classroom.

Mrs. Hill - Library

Grade 3: OVERVIEW OF LIBRARY THIS YEAR - Grade three library students will be introduced to **Destiny**, the online library catalog system. Destiny helps students find books on the shelf at the TIS library. They will review fiction, nonfiction, biography and reference books and how to tell the difference between them. Students will review three Google Apps: Docs, Slides and Forms. They will open, edit and turn in practice "assignments". They will also use Google Apps in class to complete library work such as mini research assignments. Third grade students will also participate in **STEM challenges** throughout the year in library. STEM = science, tech, engineering, and math. Sometimes an "A" is added to STEM to make STEAM - the "A" stands for art. Students will use creative thinking, cooperation, exploration, design, building, testing and presentation skills during the STEM/STEAM challenges. And, of course, third grade students will have access to almost 15,000 books in the TIS library! They will learn to search for books of interest and specific fiction genres to find "just the right books" for them! Third graders will be introduced to the Library Book Challenges!





Grade 4 and Grade 5 - Fourth and fifth grade students will review library topics they learned in earlier grades like Destiny, the online library catalog system. They will review fiction, nonfiction, biography and reference books and how to tell the difference between them. Students will review genre and are invited to participate in Library Book Challenges. Fourth and fifth grade students will also participate in STEM/STEAM challenges throughout the year in library. In addition to these lessons, students will practice simple search strategies on the internet, learning how to tell the difference between a helpful website and an advertisement. They will also use Google Apps and other tech programs like Nearpod that are fun, interactive ways to show what they learned.

Sing Like No One Is Listening

Grade 3 general music: In third grade students have started the school year learning about triplet and John Williams. Coming up next, they will be singing folk songs, playing musical instruments, reading folktales and fables, learning number counting of quarter note and eighth note rhythms. They will be doing folk dances from around the world and movement activities which teach our musical concepts.



Grade 4 General Music: In fourth grade students have started the school year learning about triplet and John Williams. Coming up next, they will be learning about the music, instruments, geography, dances and cultures of North American, South America and Australia. The students will also work on mastering the names of the notes on the treble staff and learn number counting.

Grade 5 general music: In fifth grade students have started the school year learning about triplet and John Williams. Coming up next, their focus is going to be using the musical concepts they have been learning in the

primary grades to create, perform, and compose music. Students will be doing graphic, standard notation, as well as music technology. The students will work on mastering the names of the notes on the treble staff and learn number counting. The highlight of this year's curriculum will be learning to play the ukulele. Students do NOT have to own their own ukulele. Fifth grade music will be a fun filled academic year.



Chorus for Grade 4 and Grade 5: Sign-up information for either chorus is available from Ms. Baker at any time. Both choruses will be under the direction of Ms. Baker this year. Students may sign up for both Chorus and Band! The Grade 4 & 5 Winter concert will be Wednesday,

December 6, 2023 in the TIS gym. The Grade 4 & 5 Spring concert will be Thursday, April 25, 2024 in the TIS gym. I am looking forward to an exciting musical year with our music!

Grade 4 Band: Last call for sign-ups for 4th grade Band! Gerry's Music Shop rental instruments or family owned instruments sent out for servicing should be delivered to TIS as soon as possible. Full Band began meeting on Tuesdays during our 2:40 to 3:10 p.m. WIN block. We have been reviewing rhythms and counting the beats in 4 measure rhythm patterns. Over the next several weeks, we will also have some special guest performers from the 5th grade playing their instrument, demonstrating instrument assembly and cleaning. Small group Band instruction classes began during the week of September 18th! Small group Band instruction classes meet during the school day on a pull-out basis during non-graded class time such as Keyboarding/Spanish/REACH or on an extremely limited basis from Music or PE. September and October's focus will be correct instrument assembly, producing a characteristic tone on the instrument and tap into students' concentration, confidence and responsibility skills. Our 4th graders are super excited and we have 97! Band members signed up!!!

Grade 5 Band: 5th Grade Band is open to all 5th grade students and it's not too late to sign-up! We welcome back students who started Band last year in 4th grade and also any 5th grader who wants to learn how to play a concert band instrument. In September and October we will review counting, decoding and playing eighth notes. Full Band rehearsal meets on Mondays during our 2:40 to 3:10 p.m. WIN block. Small group Band instruction classes meet during the school day on a pull-out basis during non-graded class time such as Keyboarding/Spanish/REACH or on a very limited basis from Music or PE. If your child's instrument was not cleaned or serviced over the summer, it's always a good idea to schedule your child's instrument to be cleaned and serviced. Please contact your rental company directly to make arrangements. If you own the instrument, please email me if you need suggestions for instrument servicing/repair techs.

For both Bands: If you're new to Band, several area music stores rent band instruments on a trial basis. For your convenience, Gerry's Music Shop has a representative that visits TIS during the school year every Friday. Please contact them directly to rent an instrument online or to

Raising Readers: "Serve it up as Chocolate Cake"

Standing in line waiting for the train to Gillette Stadium last Sunday, I watched three young brothers clad in Patriots jerseys flipping a half empty water bottle, trying to get it to land upright, while alternately taking turns whacking each other on the head with it. Good stuff.

More compelling than the action, though, was the dialogue. They were *discussing a book*. I recognized the characters' names. The middle boy was using literary terms like "theme" and "protagonist" and saying things like, "Did you pick up on the connection between Madame Zeroni and ...?" IN A CONVERSATION WITH HIS YOUNGER BROTHER! The younger brother was covering his ears and yelling, "Stop!" to avoid hearing the plot spoilers. Then, the oldest of the three chimed in with, "What? You actually *like* reading it?" *And then he said it.* "You know, when you get to 7th grade, you won't be reading books anymore. No one actually reads the books, anymore."

There it was. Right there on the side of the railroad tracks out of the mouth of babes. The truth. The reality of modern digital times. The water bottle whack on the head. Well, really, it's not like I hadn't noticed.

I've been teaching kids to read for 35 years and in that time, I've watched lots of kids fall in love with books and the joy that reading brings. Now that it seems as though we've **all** succumbed to digital madness, I spend a fair amount of time trying to **persuade parents** to **encourage** their children to read. I am told (often rather emphatically) that **they** didn't and don't like to read and neither do their children, so they don't. They just don't.

Ah. So... that's it for the benefits of joy, knowledge, comfort, understanding, self-regulation and future income?

Well, how about this? "The chief factor in creating readers is the household they're born into and the culture of reading the *parents* create within it." That's right. You. You hold the power. We teach them how-(fun stuff like phonological awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, comprehension and assessments) and you make them want to. That's the plan. Some really good things will come of it.

Joe Pinkser's September 19th article for The Atlantic, *Why Some People Become Lifelong Readers*. *A lot rides on how parents present the activity to their kids* offers some tips on raising readers even if you aren't an enthusiastic reader yourself. Tips Joe learned from Pamela Paul, Maria Russo, and Daniel Willingham. Tips I'd like to offer to you...as chocolate cake. Here's the first one:

Tip 1: (Challenge 1, perhaps?)

Grab a book and show kids that reading is exciting and worthwhile.

Treat reading like more like chocolate cake than spinach. Please! Puleeez! Think wonderful opportunity!

Model the time-stopping, joy-finding value of reading in the moment. If they see you happily enjoying an after dinner book, they're more likely to engage in it themselves.

(Caution: It might involve time away from the laptop, phone, or TV screen. I know. It's hard but it's worth it.)

Maybe you could start with an audiobook in the car?

NEWS FROM OUR CLASSROOMS:

Third Grade

Third graders have made a wonderful transition to Tolland Intermediate School. Teachers and students are getting used to the new routines and the different forms of learning that are going on throughout the week and the day.

We have started off the year with our Journeys Reading Program. Our focus has been on story structure and text details. Third graders are making inferences about the stories and learning about the message of a story. Our grammar skills include parts and types of sentences. We will move on to compound sentences, antonyms, as well as common and proper nouns in the next few weeks. Third grade teachers are using the Journeys programs to teach narrative and descriptive writing. Your child started writing about a favorite place by adding specific details to give the reader a picture of that place. In Fundations we have completed the orientation and Unit One. We are currently working on Unit two which includes adding suffixes to words, homophones, and 1–1–1 words.

Third grade teachers are using the Bridges Math Program this year. Your child is excited to participate in Number Corner each day. We are already working on multiplication concepts. During daily math instruction we are reviewing strategies for addition and subtraction facts. Please continue to have your child practice their addition and subtraction math facts using flashcards, math games, or Reflex. This will help them in their everyday math.

In Science we are watching our caterpillars feed on milkweed in hopes that they will continue to grow and change into monarch butterflies. Some classes have already seen their caterpillars turn into butterflies and that is always so exciting. Students are reading about monarch butterfly migration and discussing how the changes in the environment affect their survival and population growth. We have been visiting the Monarch Butterfly Garden that is on the side of the building at T.I.S. and learning about the flowers that attract butterflies. Eventually we hope to release our fully developed butterflies

into the garden and wish them well on their migration south for the winter.

In late October, we'll begin to study Tolland in the 1700s and learn about the settling of Tolland. Students will explore what life was like on a farm. Third graders will learn about the Benton Homestead in Tolland. In addition, we dive into the Legend of the Charter Oak, which is a fascinating part of Connecticut history.

We have an exciting field trip planned to the Connecticut Historical Society in Hartford October 23rd to October 27th. The students will be reenacting the Legend of the Charter Oak and learning more about this fascinating Connecticut legend. Permission slips were sent home the week of October 2nd for this trip. We also have plans to visit the Benton Homestead in November, so students can tour this historical landmark and learn more about what life was like in the 1700s. Again, thank you for all of the help you are giving your child during this school year. Together we can make this a safe and successful school year.

Fourth Grade

We are off to a great start in fourth grade! It was wonderful to see so many of you at the Open House. We look forward to working together!

Fourth grade is on a roll in many different areas. One focus at the beginning of the year has been to promote being respectful members of our Hawk community. In Math, we are working on Unit 1, Multiplicative Thinking. Reflex Math and IXL have been great resources to strengthen our math skills. We have been busy using close reading strategies to annotate and better understand text. Story structure and author's purpose have been the focus of our first few selections. Classes continue to work on elaboration and adding details to written responses. In social studies, our first unit focuses on map skills. We are using atlases to explore the features of maps and their importance.

The whole school community had our first Hawk Nest on September 27th. This gives students and teachers the opportunity to meet and share ideas with people from other grades, broadening our community experience.

We appreciate all the support that our students have gotten from parents and guardians to make the start to the school year a success.

Fifth Grade

5th graders are off to a great start! Students have settled into their routines nicely and enjoy the movement of switching classes. Students are working hard to model our HAWK expectations for all members of our community.

This year in ELA, our goal is for all of our students to develop or foster a love for reading. One way to do this is to read different genres throughout the year. Students have worked diligently throughout September to complete their Realistic Fiction book reports. We will also be reading a realistic fiction novel together in class. Students will choose a book from the Mystery genre for October. During library class, students will be able to check out books that match our monthly genres. We can't wait to learn more about different genres throughout the year!

In Social Studies throughout fifth grade, students learn early United States history, by beginning the year studying indigenous life and exploration, and ending the year with the Revolutionary War. This year's units of study are related to freedom and equality and how we became the United States of America. Throughout the year we will focus on the following question with each unit of study: How have American conceptions of freedom and equality changed from prior to colonization to the American Revolution?

This year in math, students will be using Bridges in Mathematics program again. The goal in this program is to make math more meaningful and exciting while meeting standards. We are wrapping up our first unit focused around expressions, equations, and finding volume. Students have also participated in Number Corner to introduce, reinforce and extend skills and concepts related to the math classroom and real world contexts. We are off to a great start!

The first science unit of the year is Earth, Moon and Sun. Our essential question that students will begin to answer is "How does outer space affect Earth?" Fifth grade scientists are full of excellent questions and facts about our Solar System. Keep up the good work.

The fifth-grade teachers and staff are looking forward to a wonderful school year!



School Meals 2023-2024:

All students are eligible for a free breakfast each day. Students who qualify for free or reduced-price meals will also be eligible to receive one free lunch daily. ALL OTHER LUNCHES WILL BE CHARGED AT THE CURRENT LUNCH PRICE PER SCHOOL.

Payment for these lunches is the responsibility of the parent or guardian. The district participates in the National School Lunch Program and Breakfast Program which offers students nutritionally balanced meals daily. The lunch period is 30 minutes. Proper manners are always expected in the cafeteria. Free and reduced-price meals are available based on financial need. Information on this program may be obtained from the main office or Abby Kassman-Harned, the Food Service Director, at aharned@tolland.k12.ct.us or 870-6854.

We use a Point-of-Sale System that allows you to put money into an account for your child to purchase meals.

Scanning – All students will be scanned unless the parent or guardian opts out of this biometric identification procedure. When your child comes through the service line, he/she will scan his/her finger as a means of identification.

Payments – The cost of lunch at Birch Grove and Tolland Intermediate school is \$3.15. One school breakfast is free for all students. One milk is provided for each lunch and breakfast. Ala carte milk is \$0.75. You may sign up for "My School Account" and make your payments online. Your child may give payment along with a form to his/her classroom teacher to send to the office, or he/she may bring payment directly to the cashier in the cafeteria at mealtime. Your payment may take us a few days to process. It is important to keep a positive balance in your students' accounts.
