Black History Month on Morning Announcements

Over the course of the month, our morning announcements will feature a segment in recognition of Black History Month. All month we will play songs relative to Black History Month and we will provide facts about the contributions of some extraordinary African Americans.

Monthly Theme

Our monthly theme for February is kindness. All month long on morning announcements we'll be playing songs about being kind and providing examples of how to be kind.

Our monthly kindness objectives are as follows:

- Students will be able to identify ways to act kindly to themselves and others and to be fair.
- Students will be able to understand how they can practice kindness towards themselves and others.

- Students will learn about how acts of kindness, even on the smallest scale, can trigger and inspire larger acts, such as working on a community service project or a volunteer activity.
- Students will be able to describe kind and unkind actions and learn that they have implications and can affect others.

Examples to be shared throughout the course of the month:

- When someone is having a hard time, you can help them by being kind.
- Hold the door open for someone.
- Do a chore for someone without them knowing.
- Tell a joke.
- Leave a letter or nice note in a library book.
- Pick up litter.

- Wave at kids on school buses.
- Make a get well card for someone.
- Teach someone something new.
- Reuse paper when you are drawing.
- Give high fives to a friend.
- Make a Thank You card for someone who has helped you. .
- Smile at everybody. It's contagious.

Grade 5 Esteem Presentation

Dear Fifth Grade Parents:

On Monday, February 1st, our fifth grade students will have the unique opportunity to spend a portion of the day (virtually) with students from Canton High School. The high school students are trained counselors who work with younger children as part of a program known as **Esteem**. This year marks the 23rd year that Tolland Public Schools has been partnering with the Esteem Program. The partnership began while fifth grade was a part of Tolland Middle School. Below is a portion of an article published in the Journal Inquirer about the Esteem Program visiting TMS in 2000.

TOLLAND - A group of Canton High School students spent much of Thursday with local fifth-graders, using skits, rap sessions, and audience participation to convey messages about saying no to drugs, the importance of self-esteem, and increasing communication with parents. About 20 Canton High students, specially trained as peer counselors for younger students, worked with the children throughout the afternoon and evening in the Tolland Middle School's gymnasium. The group, known as Esteem, used activities such as discussions, poems, dances, and skits. In the evening, parents of the students filled the bleachers in the gym, and watched as the fifth-graders learned about peer pressure, friends, communication among family members, control, and self-esteem.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN OUR CLASSROOMS:

GRADE 3

January 2022

We would like to thank all of the parents and families for continuing to support us during this school year. We could not do it without such wonderful families and students.

In the Journeys Reading program we have been reading stories about Thomas Edison, how technology has improved sports, and a trickster tale called Top and Bottoms. We will be moving on to a Cherokee Legend called Yonder Mountain. Third graders have been learning about idioms, homophones, verb tenses, and quotation marks. They have also been focusing on the comprehension skills of story sequence, theme, point of view, and non-fiction text features.

In writing, most classes are working on Informational Writing. Students were able to pick a topic that they feel they know a lot about and write a piece about it. Our informational writing will include, table of contents and chapters on their topic. We'll be using books from the library to expand on their knowledge of their topic as well.

In our Bridges program we are working on rounding numbers to the nearest ten and hundred. We are also spending time answering addition and subtraction problems where we need to find an estimated answer, as well as the exact answer. Making sure that your child practices math facts at home will help in our daily math. January Number Corner focused on getting more experience with fractions. We were practicing writing fractions on a number line and finding equivalent fractions. In our Calendar Collector we were collecting minutes and hours.

Please make sure that you keep your child reading books as much as possible while we aren't in school. You can read with your child, to your child, or they can read on their own.

GRADE 4

Happy New Year!!! Fourth Grade is off to a great start in 2022!

Fourth grade students are working diligently to master fractions and decimals, using various strategies and manipulatives. We continue to use IXL and Reflex Math to strengthen our skills.

In LA, we are expanding our reading skills by focusing on story structure, fact and opinion, understanding characters, conclusions and generalizations, and author's purpose. The students are working on informational writing.

Students have explored the world atlas, focusing on continents and oceans, as well as various other map skills. They are now learning about the Northeast Region of the United States.

The students have been remarkably engaged and enthusiastic this school year. We are very proud of them!!!

GRADE 5

In Language Arts, fifth-grade students are reading the "Phantom Tollbooth," by Norton Juster. It is a fun and entertaining book that focuses on humor and word play. Students are learning the difference between literal and figurative language. Students have been writing short pieces of narrative writing and will be assigned a writing task after they have completed the novel to show their knowledge of the skills they learned. Students enjoyed learning about wordplay while listening to the "Who's on First" skit by Abbott and Costello. This is a very fun topic!

In Social Studies, students are well into the second unit, "Early Settlements and Colonization." They are investigating the essential question, "How did colonization affect and change the freedom of various groups?" They are also investigating what life was like for various groups of people after colonization. Students have also been comparing and contrasting the three regions of the English colonies (New England, Middle, Southern) during the 1600s. They are also practicing their skills using IXL.

Fifth grade mathematicians are working on their unit of Place Value and Decimals. The unit includes students solving real-world style problems. They are learning patterns on the place value chart, learning fraction and decimal equivalencies, and beginning metric conversions. Their effort and perseverance is to be commended.

Students are working on their Habitat unit. The focus of this unit is on Golden Jellyfish, but also extends to the ecosystem of many different organisms. They are learning about the different parts of an ecosystem and what makes an ecosystem healthy.

Tolland Family Resource Center School Age Care Program 2022-2023

Dear Families,

It is a pleasure to have you join us at the Tolland Family Resource Center School Age Care Program (TFRC-SAC). The FRC staff members are CPR and first aid trained as well as medication certified. The program provides before and after school care at both Birch Grove Primary School and Tolland Intermediate School for children in kindergarten through grade six. Families that have children at both schools may choose to have children attend the Birch Grove site. Children in 6th grade will be bussed over to Tolland Intermediate School.

Policies and Procedures

Registration is not complete until the TFRC-SAC receives the completed forms, registration fee and deposit.

It is **very important** for the TFRC staff to know when your child will be absent from the School-Age Care Program on a scheduled day. If you call or send a note to your child's teacher to report his/her absence or early dismissal from school, **you must also notify the Family Resource Center by phone or email.**

- * The hours of the Before School Program are 7:00 a.m. until 8:30 a.m.
- * The hours of the After School Program are from the end of the school day until 6:00 p.m. A late fee will be charged after 6:00 p.m.
- * **All monthly invoices will be emailed prior to the first of the month, please notify us if your email address changes.**
- * Tuition payments are due by the 1st of the month. A late fee of \$20.00 will be charged if paid after the 5th of the month.
- * Parents may register in the Parent Portal and have the option of paying online. Parents choosing to pay us directly should place the check in the fee payment box located at each site or mailed to the Family Resource Center, 247 Rhodes Road, Tolland. Please make payments payable to **Tolland Board of Education.**
- * The center will be open during in-service/conference days and mid-winter/spring breaks. Advance registration is required for non-school days. Registration will be accepted on a first come first serve basis. Additional fees will be charged for these days.

We must have 15 children enrolled to open.

- * The program is closed for all public school holidays, the winter break in December, and any closings due to inclement weather.
- * **Should your childcare needs change and you would like to add additional days you must complete a Change in Registration Form. (Found on the website) Approval will be based on enrollment. If you need to withdraw your child from the program or decrease the number of days your child attends a one-month notice must be given to the coordinator. Please complete the Change in Registration Form.**

If your child attends on Half Days an additional \$10.00 will be added to your next invoice.

Registration Fee: \$50.00 per child/ \$75.00 per family.

Monthly Tuition Rates are based on the school year *please note that these fees may be subject to an increase.

The monthly fee stated above is the same for all ten payments of the school year. All vacations, teacher in-service/ conference days, and half days are additional and are not included in your monthly charge.

Tuition Deposit:

50% of your **last month's tuition** must be submitted with the registration.

If you decide to remove your child prior to the start of the program, you need to withdraw by August 1.

If this notice is not given, the deposit will be forfeited.

Sibling Discount:

There is a 5% sibling discount. The sibling discount does NOT apply if the family is receiving financial assistance.

Late Pick-Up Fee:

There is a \$1.00 charge per minute per child for late arriving parents. Three late pick-ups from the program may result in dismissal.

Late Payment Fee:

A \$20.00 charge will be assessed to your account if payment is not received by the 5th of the month.

Monthly invoices will be emailed after the 15th of the month.

Return Check Fee:

A \$20.00 charge will be assessed to your account for checks returned for nonsufficient funds, "NSF".

Financial Assistance:

Assistance with childcare fees may be available to qualifying families. Please contact Carol Hiller at chiller@tolland.k12.ct.us for more information.

The second print design was a design made from 5 or more overlapping **Geometric shapes or free forms**. As we finish up our printing projects we will be moving on to painting. The fourth graders will learn about color families, mixing colors and tints and shades. We will need students to bring their **smocks** all month, because all three projects are very messy.

Grade 5 The fifth graders will be working on **Flip books** and learning about **Animation**. After we finish the flip books we will move onto **Pop Art**, and learn about the artist, **Andy Warhol**. The Art term **Pop Art** comes from the shortened word **popular**. This new style of art was created in the 1950's with artwork designs that came from popular household items, comic strips, and famous movie stars. The 5th graders will select an item that is popular to them and create their own POP Art print.

Hello Parents. In the art room, students will not be permitted to wear their winter coats in class. Please, send a smock to protect and cover your child's

clothes. The art room is used by three different grades and there are messy projects going on all the time.

Mrs. Hill - Library Media

During the month of January, all TIS students will complete a **Destiny review**.

This review is important to check for mid-year understanding. Destiny is the online card catalog that students use to look up library books. Lessons have been taught about identifying call numbers such as F for fiction. Students will be given time to practice Destiny skills, if needed.

Later in January, all TIS students will complete a **Nearpod lesson about the life, work and legacy of Martin Luther King, Jr.** The Nearpod lesson has articles to read, videos to watch and interactive questions, polls, and a drawing activity.

Ms. Baker - General Music

Let's celebrate Kindness!



Grade 3 general music:

Third graders are working on their xylophone playing skills while keeping a steady beat. They are singing folksongs and adding songs and instruments to some of Aesop's fables. Soon we will begin learning some colonial folk dances. The students are now studying about the composer Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. The students are also practicing their rhythm reading and music vocabulary.



Grade 4 general music: The fourth graders are learning about the music, instruments, folklore and dances of Africa. The students are just starting to learn hand drumming skills and techniques and will be singing as they play. The students are now studying about the composer Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and they are also practicing their rhythm reading and music vocabulary.



Grade 5 general music: The fifth graders have started learning how to play the ukulele. They will be learning how to read chord charts, tabs, strumming patterns and sing while they play. There are resources in their google classrooms for the students to continue playing on their own. Students are not required to purchase their own ukulele but, if you or your student are interested in investing in your own ukulele contact me in order to find a quality instrument at a reasonable price.

Mrs. Marchesani - 4th and 5th grade Band/Chorus

Grade 4 and 5 Chorus: 4th grade Chorus meets on Fridays at 8:00 am before school or during recess. 5th grade Chorus meets on Mondays at 8:00 am before school or during recess. Our current focus is developing proper singing techniques and healthy vocal habits. One of our long term goals is to sing rounds, partner songs and two part harmony.

Grade 4 Band: One standout favorite song with 4th grade Band members is “Good King Wenceslas” #26 in our Standard of Excellence books. Tied notes are a new concept for Band members. “Farm Out” (Old MacDonald Had a Farm) is a fun song to practice this concept!

Grade 5 Band: Students have completed the Concert Bb “Scale Preps for Beginning Band” by Mike Hannickel and have begun learning the Concert Eb scale preps. The Concert Eb Scale Preps will help with learning “Regal March”, “Montego Bay” and many other songs with that key signature. Our playing eighth notes review is going very well! Playing eighth note rhythms helps students as they begin to learn “Regal March”. 5th grade Band members are having fun learning “Latin Magic”, a band arrangement based on two Mexican folk melodies. One of the melodies was made famous in 1958 by Ritchie Valens in his hit song “La Bamba”.




